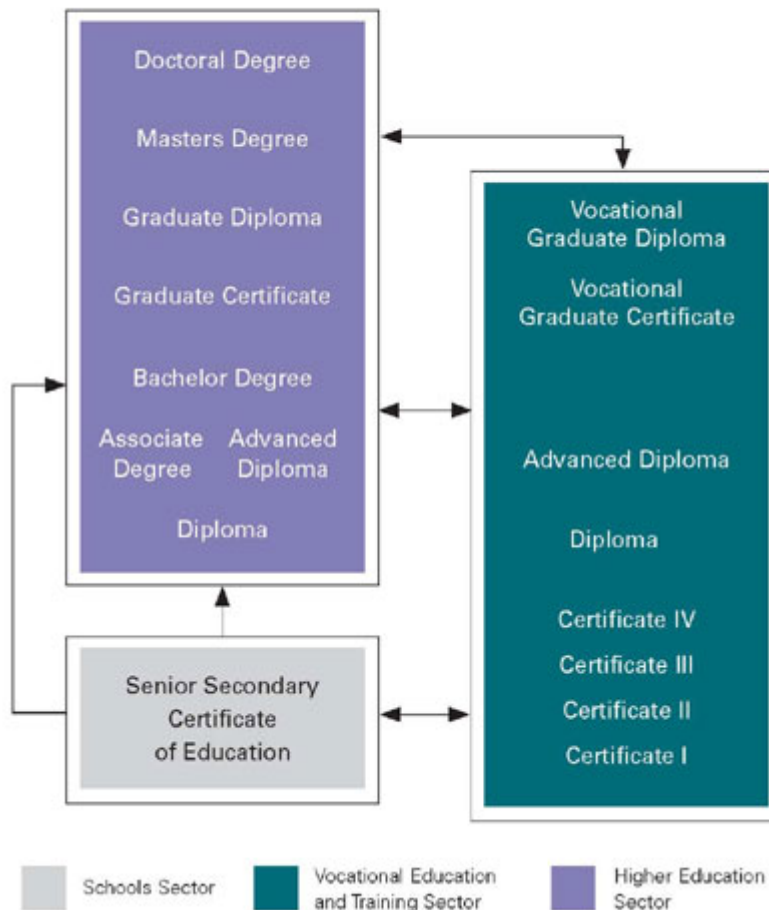


## Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF)

An important consideration in the assessment of your application for an exemption for a Kaplan subject is the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) level of the studies upon which you are basing your application. The table below gives an overview of AQF levels:

The Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) table above may help you to rank the level of your qualification against the level of the Kaplan qualification for which you are applying for an exemption.

If applying for exemptions into Kaplan higher education courses please note that these subjects are offered at postgraduate level and therefore at a higher level than undergraduate (bachelor's degree) or diploma level studies.

There is a difference in the level, content, assessment and expectations of study and research at postgraduate level. To be eligible for an exemption you will need to demonstrate that your previous studies were at postgraduate level and that your knowledge of financial markets is up to date.

If your previous studies were at a lower AQF level you will need to demonstrate how you have addressed the difference in AQF levels to qualify for an exemption into a subject at a higher level.
