

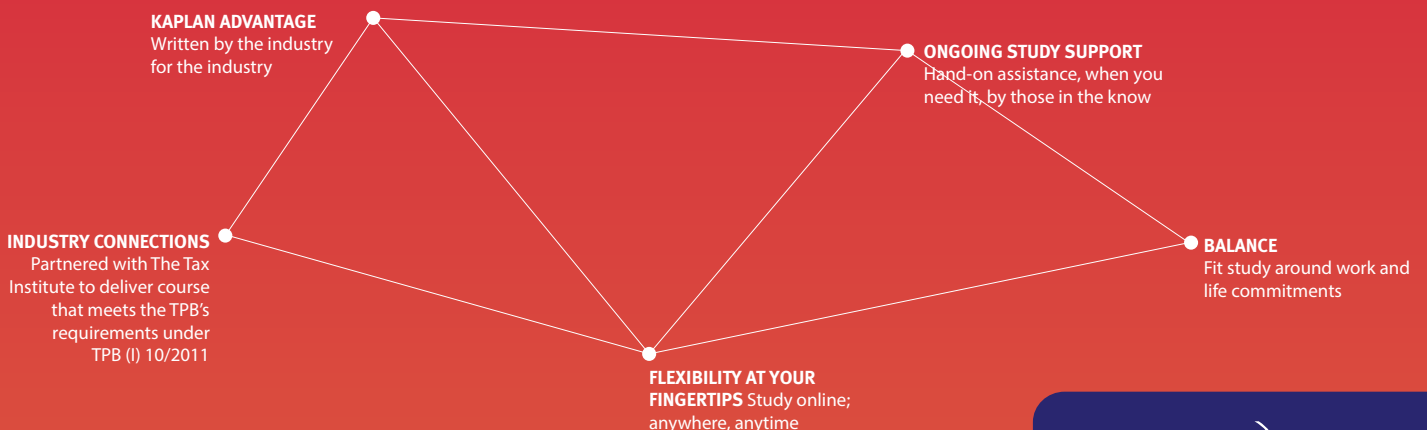

**TASA 2009 and the
TPB Code of
Professional Conduct**

This subject is for financial advisers who provide tax (financial) advice services and are registered with the Tax Practitioners Board (TPB) as a tax (financial) adviser.

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The TPB considers it essential a registered agent be able to demonstrate their knowledge of the Tax Agents Services Act (TASA), including the Code of Professional Conduct as part of the requirements for registration, and to be able to meet their statutory obligations in relation to the provision of tax agent services.
